It was exciting to have the cast and crew from the Chinese TV show 'Speed' filming throughout the region recently, especially seeing stunt people right outside my office on Nile Street in the historic precinct of Port Adelaide.

Council have a number of big projects underway right across the region. We have finished our first stage of consultation for the Lightsview Indoor Recreation Hub and received lots of fantastic input from our community about what they want to see in the facility.

We have also undertaken an initial consultation on our Animal Management Plan to get a range of ideas about how we can make our city a better, safer place for you and your pets.

Wonderwalls brought a number of amazing new artworks to walls in Port Adelaide during April as well as a huge influx of visitors, with many local business owners having one of their busiest days ever. There are photos online, however, it is definitely worth downloading a map from the Wonderwalls website and going to see them in person to admire the sheer scale and beauty of these pieces.

As winter brings in colder weather, we still have plenty of events and activities happening. A number of events coming up have been supported through our grants program, and of course our libraries and community centres continue to be a hive of activity throughout the year.

To highlight this, we have started rolling out a series of short videos from across council, which give our residents a glimpse into the jobs we do and the people who do them; you can find these on our Facebook page by searching for 'City of PAE'. KEY DECISIONS

Your elected members meet every month to discuss a range of matters related to community life. Meetings are open to the public and everyone is welcome to attend. Here are just some of the key decisions made at recent meetings.

Meeting held 14 March 2017

- Following the success of the previous Klemzig Reserve Cinema Night, Council has set aside \$5,000 for another event in Spring/Summer 2017.
- Council endorsed the pilot of a Place Making approach, see page 12.
- Council endorsed its continuing opposition to rate capping, recognising that Port Adelaide Enfield Council has been amongst the lowest residential rating metropolitan councils over a number of years.

Meeting held 11 April 2017

- Subject to the consent by the Minister for Sustainability, Environment and Conservation and community consultation, Council in its capacity as landlord, agreed to the establishment of a new lease for Sunnybrae Estate with existing tenant for a base term of 42 years.
- Council endorsed plans to proceed with the development of a new shared use path around the outside of the Semaphore Palais Hotel marquee, including work on related revegetation and dune rehabilitation.

Meeting held 5 May 2017

- Council committed to join and participate in the Welcoming Cities Network.
- Recognising the \$293,000 contribution towards the Taperoo Park Project from the State Local Government Partnership grants, Council resolved to progress this multi-year project.

GOVERNOR TOURS OUR CITY

In March, we welcomed His Excellency The Honourable Hieu Van Le, Governor of South Australia, and Mrs Le for a tour and overview of some of the exciting projects happening in our city at the moment.

We were thrilled to be able to show off some of the major projects and showcase our plans for new facilities and infrastructure in the community.

The morning was spent visiting key locations as part of our activation program in Port Adelaide, including Fontanelle in the old Post Office, Mixed Creative in the old hospital, the Port Admiral which is undergoing renovations ready for opening in August, and the First Commercial Hotel.

The group then boarded a bus to visit the other exciting projects Council is undertaking across the city.

The first stop was the new Dock One development which kicks off in the Port soon. Next was the new Taperoo football facility, followed by the new Roy Marten dog park.

After passing through Techport, the Outer Harbor Passenger Terminal, and Semaphore Road, the group travelled to the eastern side of the city to view the site for the new Lightsview Indoor Recreation Hub and the new Parks Library and Community Centre and the Kilburn Community Centre.


PRESERVING UNIQUE MARITIME HERITAGE OF THE PORT

A maritime precinct has been proposed for Dock 2 at Port Adelaide as part of the State Government's plans to preserve and promote the district's unique maritime heritage.

Dock 2 is identified in the Historic Ships and Boats Strategy as the preferred site to host land-based historic vessels such as the City of Adelaide clipper ship and the schooner Nelcebee.

The Strategy was released in April to coincide with the 30th anniversary of the One and All – the iconic purpose-built sailing ship operated by volunteers.

The Strategy sets out a plan for preserving and celebrating the unique maritime heritage of Port Adelaide and makes a series of recommendations, including that existing water-based vessels, such as the One and All and the Falie, should remain at their location at McLaren's Wharf. The Port Adelaide Athletics Club received an integration grant from the Office of Recreation and Sport in 2016 to set up a brand new Indigenous athletics programme.

Flyers were distributed through local schools and council networks to help get the inaugural squad together.

Kaurna elders gave the Club permission to use the Kaurna word for Port Adelaide – Yartapuulti.

In the club's first year, 37 athletes entered the programme ready to give it their all. Athletes were coached on fitness, technique, sprints, jumps and throws with the view to competing at Athletics SA interclub meets.

Chair of the Port Adelaide Enfield Council’s Aboriginal Advisory Panel, Michael O’Brien Kumatpi Marrutya, performed the Kaurna Welcome to Country.

Northfield Primary School, had assembled a mix of Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal students under the guidance of Aboriginal Community Education Officer Josie Warrior, created and performed their reconciliation danced to the Michael Jackson song “Black or White.”

YOUNG LIGHTSVIEW HEROES

After identifying the house, these young guys alerted residents, neighbours and the fire brigade, before assisting with the evacuation of the property and neighbouring properties.

The story came to the attention of Cr Mark Basham from Northfield Ward, who wanted to show Council's appreciation for their efforts and positive contributions to the safety of their community.

At the April Council meeting, certificates of appreciation were awarded to recognise their selfless and brave acts in helping others to safety.

Jayden's dad Cam said, "The boys are still on a high relishing in the moment, receiving this award really meant a lot to them."

After the home and away games concluded this season, the club had a team in each Division Final. The Division 1 team won, defeating North Lakes. Division 2 were defeated by North Haven and Division 3 were defeated by North Adelaide, although the results were close.

Since 1983 Regency Park Golf Club has won the Division 1 Pennant 18 times and Division 2 13 times exceeding competition expectations against larger clubs.

Rise Community Youth Group

YOUTH GROUPS PROVIDE A POSITIVE ENVIRONMENT FOR YOUNG PEOPLE IN THE EAST

For the past six years, the Rise Community Youth Group has been running programs and activities for young people in their state of the art facility in Lightsvue.

The group's leaders are committed to making a difference in the lives of young people by taking an active role in mentoring and supporting them through issues such as identity, relationships, friendships, purpose, leadership and endurance.

Their vision is that any young person can connect and belong, be it, through the video games, sports, music and challenges whilst establishing quality relationships with other young people and leaders.

There are two programs that run parallel to each other, each with upwards of 60 students attending each week. The two programs are separated so each age group can connect on their own personal level.

Mentors include teachers, chaplains and various other child-related professions. This helps the group to cater for students with additional needs, such as Autism Spectrum Disorder and Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD). They also work with the Department of Child Protection to support children in care.

Group Leader Nathan Watkins is proud of how the group can provide a positive environment for children. "One child I'll always remember, first attended when he was in Year 7. At the time his family was stuck in a cycle of destructive behaviour. The youth group to him, was a place where he felt like he belonged and was loved and cared about. What appeared to be an almost hopeless situation has now become a student with drive. He finished Year 12, won a Children's Week Award for volunteering with children and is training to be a manager at a fast food restaurant."

The Rise Community Youth Group is Christian-based, however there is no expectation or pressure that participants change their religious views. Ruthmary opened the second Experience Café at 5 Clifton Street Blair Athol in 2016 and on 11 March this year the new café was abuzz with people, music, food and activities as they celebrated their first birthday. The celebration was also a re-launch as the cafe was handed over to a new manager/operator.

The new manager, Sophie Langley is also an artist and is keen to give plenty of opportunity for creative expression in the café community. Regular art exhibitions are one of the new features and also a vibrant art group on Friday morning called Creative Connections. Other new activities include a Friday morning English conversation group with Belinda, a friendly and skilled ESL teacher; also a multicultural women's support group and even a 'singing bowls' practitioner has been coming in with some good vibrations on Wednesdays!

There is a delightful community garden behind the cafe and Jenny, who heads up a group meeting Wednesday mornings, is excited to be implementing a new permaculture design. The café's manager, Sophie, is coordinating with Jen in the garden and Briony in the op shop (also on the property) to create a thriving community hub.

The café is open Wednesday to Saturday 10am – 3pm so make some time to come check out this innovative and exciting community endeavor; Sophie and the staff would be very pleased to see you and you can sample some yummy fresh homemade lunches and cakes – and of course fantastic coffee!

TURNING THE TIDE ON PLASTICS IN OUR OCEANS

Adelaide artist Andrew Baines is known for his high impact, surreal images. Members of the public took part in his latest art piece and became part of a living art work with a message in Largs Bay during May.

A series of photographs were taken which aimed to draw attention to the devastating impact of micro-plastics in our oceans.

Mayor Gary Johanson had pushed the project and was excited about the opportunity to get people thinking about their natural surroundings in new ways.

“We are working together to raise awareness of the impact of plastics on marine environments and to encourage solutions to plastic problems and marine litter along with the devastating effects these have on our natural environment.”

“It is a chance to contemplate the ocean whilst creating a living art work for onlookers to ponder over.”

Andrew said, “You’re standing in the water for 15 to 20 minutes and you’re just looking out into the horizon and you sort of become one with nature and it brings out your primeval sort of instincts.”

Mayor Johanson said, “Protecting our environment forms a significant part of our City of Port Adelaide Enfield City Plan 2030.”

“As we move into the future we are looking at everything from waste management planning through to how we can implement programs, all with the goal of becoming more environmentally sustainable and protecting our natural assets for ourselves and for future generations.”

The event was a collaboration between United Nations Association of Australia (SA), The City of Port Adelaide Enfield, United Nations Information Centre and Surrealist Artist Andrew Baines.

PAINTING THE WAY

John and Colin have spent the past 13 years working together marking road lines right across the City of Port Adelaide Enfield. Although not all roads have lines on them, City of PAE is responsible for 691km of local roads and our line-marking teams work over a two year cycle meaning that every line gets painted at least once every two years.

We have 250km of white lines and 93km of yellow lines on our streets, but when you add onto that everything else such as parking spaces, give way blocks (2645m²), stop markings (556m²), white splay (5808m²), bike symbols (253) etc. That’s an awful lot of paint!

DRAFT ENVIRONMENT STRATEGY

Consultation on our Draft Environment Strategy 2022 was held throughout March and April. Thank you to everybody who participated in workshops, drop in sessions and provided written submissions. Some of the suggested areas for change included strengthening the Strategy’s focus on built heritage issues, cultural landscapes, environmental education and behaviour change, greening of the urban environment and having a clear implementation plan.

After a successful 12 month trial period that expired on 31 May 2017, the State Government has approved Jack Watkins Reserve in Kilburn to become a permanent Dry Area effective 1 June 2017.

BUSINESS SUPPORT GRANTS

In January 2016 the State Government launched the Northern Economic Plan which covers the cities of Port Adelaide Enfield, Salisbury and Playford. The plan was in response to the impending closure of the Holden's factory at Elizabeth which we now know will close on 20 October 2017.

One of the outcomes of the Northern Economic Plan was the creation of a \$10 million dollar fund to assist new Start-up Businesses (grants up to the value of \$20,000) and business expansions for companies with less than 20 employees who have an expansion opportunity (grants up to the value of \$100,000). The funding is on a dollar for dollar matched basis for capital improvement projects that have direct employment outcomes – creating new jobs in the region.

Up until 31 May 2017 approximately 20 new Start Up businesses and 25 expanding businesses shared in almost \$1.98million in grants within the City of Port Adelaide Enfield. This equates to almost 100 new jobs in the region.

With the businesses matched funding that is an injection of nearly \$4million into supporting jobs growth of Port Adelaide Enfield businesses. This is a great outcome for the local economy and increasing employment opportunities across the Council.

One of the businesses successful in gaining an expansion grant was Mega Courts Indoor Sports at Windsor Gardens. The grant assisted in the expansion of the range of activities offered and establishment of a retail presence resulting in 5 FTE jobs.

If your business is considering applying for one of these Start Up or expansion Grants, the next round of grants closes on 12 July 2017.
