It's hard to believe that it is June already and we are almost halfway through this year. We have recently been busy formalising our Business Plan for the 2018-19 financial year. Our Elected Members and Council staff worked hard to determine your priorities, and we have now wrapped up the period for community consultation on our Annual Business Plan and Budget which will inform the work we do over the next year. We received some great comments and feedback and I always appreciate it when community members and groups take the time to consider what has been proposed.

We believe our service delivery, facilities and programs should always be informed by the voice of our community. It's important that what we provide is what you want and need. The most important and valuable information to shape our direction is the information provided by our community.

It has been a busy period of activity around the region, with plenty of construction happening at the new Parks Library and Taperoo Soccer Reserve which are both getting close to completion, and groundworks getting underway at The Lights.

The new State Government building has already made its mark on our Port Adelaide skyline and nears completion as the revitalisation of the Port continues. I look forward to welcoming the first group of over 550 new workers who will soon call the Port home... and with a view of our river dolphins from their office windows, I'm sure they can't wait to arrive!

In May, a decommissioned gun from HMAS Protector - South Australia's only ever naval ship - was returned to the prominent location where it previously stood for 85 years. This important piece of our state's history now again sits overlooking the coastline it once protected and I'm proud to have played a part in pushing to get it returned.

In April, the 2018 South Australian LG Professionals Excellence Awards were held to showcase the very best across local government in the state. Two of our projects were shortlisted as finalists and we were thrilled to be presented with the award for "Innovative Management Initiatives" for our social media video series, including Weekly News and Day in the Life. This award highlights how we are broadening the ways we communicate with residents and the community. We also recently picked up our trophy for the Best Dressed Town during the Tour Down Under and I'd like to personally thank everybody involved in this amazing achievement for a first time stage host.

Finally I'd like to take a moment to congratulate Cr Carol Martin OAM on receiving her Order of Australia Medal, and Cr Ray Guscott on 20 years of dedicated service to our city. Thank you both for all your hard work.

- Waste Management Strategy 2018-2023 was adopted.
- Council will submit a response to the Australian Electoral Commission to indicate Council's support for the retention of the name Port Adelaide as a federal electorate division.

VOICE OF THE COMMUNITY

In 2016 we introduced the Community Indicators survey to better understand our community's perception about the City. Results from the survey are then populated into our City Scorecard which informs us about changes to perceptions in an effort to identify if we are on track with our aspirations, as embodied in the City Plan 2030.

We were purposeful in the design and data collection approach for the 2017 survey and have integrated the survey outcomes with our business planning and budgeting process for 2018-19. This process ensures we continue to provide opportunities for people to be the voice of our community so we are able to understand our community's perspective.

We encouraged greater participation in the consultation process for our 2017 survey. By engaging with people who were linked to our email networks, through website updates and social media posts along with our printed materials, we were able to increase the survey responses from 400 in 2016 to more than 2,300 respondents in 2017.

The greater number of responses provides us greater assurance the information we take out of the survey strongly represents the views of our community. Our website has been updated with data about what we heard from the survey; this information contributes towards the identification of priority areas of focus, which in turn builds our key activities. As a result, we are able to build a Business Plan and Budget which reflects what our people say is important.

CHANGES TO DOG AND CAT MANAGEMENT

In July 2015, a Citizen's Jury was established by the State Government to look at how to reduce the number of unwanted pets that are put down in South Australia every year and to prevent the cruel practice of puppy farming. The Jury were asked to consider what measures could be implemented or trialed and found general community support for compulsory de-sexing for new dogs and cats, and mandatory microchipping of pets. As a result, new laws for cat and dog owners will come into effect on 1 July 2018. This year's registration renewal notices will be arriving in letterboxes from 9 July.

Microchipping is the most effective form of permanent identification for your dog or cat. Microchipping your dog or cat will make it easier to quickly reunite you with your pet in the event they become lost, and allows our Community Safety Officers to get them home to you without impounding. Owners must microchip all dogs and cats by 1 July 2018. All new generations of dogs and cats must be microchipped by 12 weeks of age or at the point of sale. Owners are encouraged to take advantage of the numerous discount microchipping days throughout the state, including the upcoming microchip day at Enfield Community Centre on Sunday 29 July from 10am-4pm. The cost for microchipping is just \$10.

From 1 July 2018, all dog and cat microchip details must be recorded on the statewide database, Dogs and Cats Online which will make it easy for you to update your details should you move, change phone number or if your pet is lost or passes away, there is no cost to keep or update a dog or cat's microchip details on Dogs and Cats Online.

All dogs and cats born after 1 July 2018 must be de-sexed by a registered veterinary surgeon:

- before it is 6 months of age; or
- within 28 days after the owner takes possession of the dog or cat; or
- before the day specified in the exemption if the owner of a dog or cat is granted an extension of time.

These new laws will simplify the dog registration process, make it easier to reunite lost dogs and cats with their owners, help identify and put a stop to puppy farms and ultimately reduce euthanasia rates.



LOOKING FOR WALK LEADERS

The City of Port Adelaide Enfield has become a Host Organisation for the Heart Foundation Walking Program. Walking in a group creates strong social connections, helps people to take notice of the world around them, provides opportunity to be more active, helps maintain motivation and builds positive wellbeing.

Physical activity on its own improves physical health and reduces risk factors for diseases such as type 2 diabetes, heart disease and some cancers.

We encourage people living in the council area to enjoy our walking trails, fitness stations and open spaces.

You can be part of a Heart Foundation Walking group no matter what your ability or level of fitness. Walking is a great way to see your neighbourhood and meet the people who live there!

Heart Foundation Walking groups are already active in Semaphore, Port Adelaide, Holden Hill and Gilles Plains. The Kilburn Community Centre is coordinating a new group on Tuesday and Thursday mornings, departing about 9.15am.

WHO'S IN CHARGE

Youth and Family Support Workers, Trevor and Kay, have been delivering the Who's in Charge program for more than ten years. The program is targeted at parents and carers of young people (8-18 years) who are beyond control, violent or defiant.

As children become teenagers, their needs for support in times of stress change, and as dynamics evolve, many parents need guidance around how to handle conflict within their family relationships.

Trevor and Kay have seen the ways in which the program makes a real difference to the family relationships. Trevor says "It can be very scary when a child lashes out. Many parents feel guilt or shame when their child's behaviour is confrontational or hurtful and we help parents to re-establish themselves as head of the household."

The short course offers insight into the power struggles and dynamics of family relationships, and offers ideas to help develop individual strategies for managing behaviours that can lead to problems. THE LIFEBLOOD OF OUR COMMUNITY

The Port Adelaide Red Cross Blood Donor Centre has re-opened following a \$750,000 refurbishment which will make it easier and more comfortable for locals to give blood and save even more lives.

New donor chairs, a more open-plan collection floor and updated reception and refreshment areas are among some of the new additions to the nine-year-old blood bank, at 95 St. Vincent Street, Port Adelaide.

“We are so proud of our new home and can’t wait to share it with all our donors who have been very patient throughout the changes,” Port Adelaide Blood Donor Centre Manager, Jayne Jeffrey said.

“The new-look centre will have improved flow to help make donors’ blood donations more seamless with the same friendly staff,” she said.

“We’re hoping locals who have never donated before will come and visit us and give blood for the very first time.”

Peter Wildy was the first to donate at the new-look centre. His donation was the 114,603rd collected at the Port centre since first opening its doors almost a decade ago.

“It’s my community service,” he says of his legendary donation today. “I see blood donation as one of those things you can do to help other people – I refer to it as my good deed for the month.”

Peter routinely donates life-giving plasma every four weeks and started donating as a teen following in the footsteps of his donor parents.

The Blood Service is funded by the Commonwealth and State Governments via the National Blood Authority. It collects 25,000 donations a week across Australia and is pivotal to the health and wellbeing of thousands of Australians. MAJOR UPGRADE FOR CHURCH STREET

Work has started on a major upgrade of Church Street in Port Adelaide, between Hack Street and Dale Street.

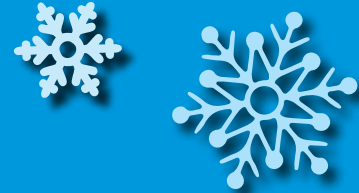
Construction includes new footpaths, landscaping, new street lighting and improved pedestrian crossing facilities. With the Port undergoing a revival at the moment, that includes the \$300 million development works kicking off around the waterfront, and a massive redevelopment of the Port Canal Shopping Centre underway, the Church Street upgrade will tie in nicely with nearby development projects.

Construction of Stage 1 of the Church Street upgrade is expected to be completed by mid June 2018. Stage 2 is anticipated to commence mid July 2018 with an expected completion date of mid-October 2018. Timing of both stages will be dependent on weather and other unforeseen circumstances which may arise.

The proposed works will include the rearrangement of pedestrian crossings, reshaping and widening of the road, new kerbing, landscaping, lighting upgrades and more.

UNIQUE POSTCARDS SHOWCASE OUR HERITAGE

British born Ray Marchant is one of our dedicated volunteers who work at the Port Adelaide Visitor Information Centre. When he isn't behind the counter, you will probably find him colouring in drawings of local buildings on his computer.

Ray has lovingly created eight different postcards featuring iconic buildings in Semaphore and Port Adelaide, which are now on sale for \$1 each at the Visitor Information Centre, with funds from the sale going into the running of the centre. Ray has a passion for unique architecture, "Most of my recent works are of local buildings, I particularly enjoy the look of the older 19th century buildings."

His creations have a unique look thanks to his personal art style that he developed during his working life working as a technical illustrator; before moving into computer graphics. In 1989 he moved to Australia from London to work in Sydney before settling in Port Adelaide after falling in love with the area six years ago.

He combines his drawing skills with rendering and computers. First he sketches the outline of the building freehand with a pen, then scans this onto his computer and colours it on screen, producing a modern take on a traditional art style.

When asked about traditional versus modern art, Ray said "I love the versatility and brightness of digital colouring, but I can still grab a paintbrush and turn out a reasonable watercolour painting if I need to!"

POTHoles NO PROBLEM FOR DALE

We run a constant program of minor road maintenance to ensure that our roads are safe for vehicles to drive on. Work includes fixing potholes, resurfacing damaged areas and ensuring that the edges of roads are strong and safe for vehicles to drive over.

As part of our 'Day in the Life' video series that you can watch on our @cityofpae social media, we chatted with Dale who works in one of our Minor Road Maintenance Crews. Dale has been with us for five years and takes pride in making sure our roads are in top shape.

When they head out to a job, first they cut out a section around the damaged part of the road and rip up the old surface. Then they repair the base with compacted crushed rock, before putting slurry on top, followed by bitumen down which gets rolled flat to finish the job. The truck holds four tonnes of bitumen and uses heat from the exhaust to keep the bitumen at 180 degrees.

BUILDING STRENGTH FOR LIFE

The Strength for Life program is a project of COTA South Australia which enables people 50 years and over to participate in quality group strength and fitness training sessions through the development of an individualised program to suit each person's fitness levels.

The program, held at the Lefevre Community Stadium, has become so popular that the number of weekly sessions offered has jumped from two to six, and the total number of participants has more than doubled since last year.

Over 200 people are currently registered in the program which has benefited greatly from newly purchased fitness equipment. Lefevre Community Stadium recently hosted a free information day which enabled members of the community to find out more about the program. COTA South Australia CEO Jeanette Richards gave a presentation to the participants on the benefits the program has on assisting people in living a healthy and active lifestyle no matter what their age and fitness levels.

By incorporating the fitness sessions into a fun, social and relaxing atmosphere the Strength for Life program continues to have a positive impact on the overall wellbeing of people on the Lefevre Peninsula. The recent increase in participation shows just how important classes like these are and that there is real demand in our community for them.

The decision to run night-time classes is our latest move to make sessions available to all older people in our community, but particularly those who are in their 50s and 60s and still working.

Programs are set at a pace that suits each person, building strength over time with professional supervision, a commitment to best practice and safe, tailored regimes.

PARKS LIBRARY UPDATE

Construction of the new Parks Library is progressing well, with the steel wall and window framing now complete. Installation of first fix mechanical and electrical services is close to being finished, with wall and ceiling linings commencing soon. The installation of windows and doors, external cladding to the walls and eaves on the rest of the building began in May.

As part of the project scope, we will be making some major improvements to the roads and footpaths at the intersection to Yerta Walk and Park Street. This will allow the building to be accessible from all sides, with the opportunity to open the building up for public events.

Behind the scenes we have been working on the technology, systems, programming and collection to support and benefit our customers. The Parks Library will provide access to the latest technology, including virtual reality and a recording hub. There will be "makerspaces" for upskilling and discovery, community spaces for events and enjoyment, a toy library for play and a multicultural collection.

Sculptures at the front entrance will be a focal point of the design and these are being created with an artist and local community members. We are on track to be open to the community and fully operational by early October 2018.



ANNA'S SPECIAL PATH

On International Women's Day, on 8 May, the Anna Rennie Chapter hosted a cocktail breakfast to celebrate the official renaming and dedication of the Port Loop Path to 'The Anna Rennie Path'.

Anna Rennie was a pioneer of social justice in Port Adelaide. After training as a nurse at the Adelaide Hospital, Anna became increasingly active in the community. She campaigned for improvements to the food ration scheme in Port Adelaide and played an important part in establishing the Port Archway facility, the first Meals on Wheels kitchen in Australia and a kindergarten in Wellington Street, Port Adelaide.

Anna served as a Councillor for South Ward from 1950-1964, being the first female Councillor to serve Port Adelaide Council, and as Mayor from 1964 -1969, for the City of Port Adelaide.

She was the first female Mayor in the metropolitan area of South Australia. As Mayor she supported Labor Day processions, established sports clubs and the Swan Terrace Olympic Pool, Senior Citizens Clubs and the Port Market Carparks. Her work improved Glanville Hall and made it available to the first Elderly Citizens Club in the district.

She was responsible for delivering an extensive works program which resulted in footpaths on 250 different streets, kerbing and water tabling in 200 streets and 30 new storm water drains totalling 32000 feet. She arranged the purchase of land to enlarge the Birkenhead Reserve, Port Adelaide Oval, Largs North Oval, Osborne House Reserve and Junction Road Reserve. She was also responsible for the building of South Australian Housing Trust Units for the aged being built in Port Adelaide, the first in South Australia.

Named in her honour, the Anna Rennie Path is a shared use cycling and pedestrian loop path providing a 3.5km route around the inner harbor and riverfront. It provides a place to be active, or a spot to relax and partake in a bit of dolphin watching. The Anna Rennie Chapter, a local group that works to connect and support women within metropolitan Adelaide, advocated for the naming of the path. HEAVE AND HAUL TO LIPSON

To finish off our Lipson Street stormwater works and streetscape upgrade, we commissioned artists Danica Gacesa McLean and Steve Hayter to develop a sculpture that depicts the rich history of the Port precinct. They were assisted by Trevor Wren and Jason Hindes.

The sculpture, titled "Heave & Haul" was inspired by the Block and Tackle - an ancient piece of equipment used by both seamen and wharfies.

When describing the finished piece, Danica (pictured) said, "Heave & Haul celebrates the hard and often dangerous working life of seamen who heaved away on ropes in storms on the high seas to discover new lands or transport cargo, and the wharfies who hauled this cargo from ship to shore."

We love this huge new sculpture, which sits proudly on the corner of Lipson Street, right outside the South Australian Maritime Museum, one of the three historic museums in the Port Precinct, along with the National Railway Museum and the South Australian Aviation Museum.



THANK YOU FOR RECYCLING

South Australians have long led the way with recycling and with your help we can demonstrate our commitment to 'recycling right' into the future. It is important for everyone in our community to play their part in increasing recycling by using yellow lid recycling bins properly and ensuring valuable materials are not wasted in landfill.

Here's a refresher about what items can be recycled in the yellow lid bin:

- Aluminium foil sheets and trays - roll into a ball the size of a tennis ball
- Cardboard - clean food packaging boxes, and cards- not tied or shredded
- Glass bottles and jars- rinsed, lids off
- Paper, newspaper, magazines - not tied or shredded
- Plastic bottles - rinsed, lids off
- Rigid plastic containers - rinsed
- Steel and aluminium cans - rinsed, lids off

Please ensure that the lids of all of your wheelie bin remain closed whether they are at your house or awaiting collection. Do not fill your bins to overflowing as this can cause waste items to be easily blown out of bins by the wind and litter our streets and neighbourhoods. If your lid is broken or your bin is damaged, we will repair it for free, just visit our website to lodge an online request, or call the waste line free call 1800 777 844.

KERBSIDE WHEELIE BIN AUDIT

There will be a small number of wheelie bins audited during Winter 2018. Waste and recycling audits provide valuable insight into items residents have issues with disposing of and help us improve waste and recycling services.

The audit will be anonymous with the selected bins materials collected and combined in a waste collection vehicle that offloads at a waste transfer station for material sorting and analysis. The information gathered will inform a program that will help our community reduce landfill through an education campaign.

SA WATER UPGRADES

The sewer network which provides sanitation services to tens of thousands of residents and businesses in Adelaide's north-west will soon be upgraded to support future growth in the area and improve odour management.

SA Water are undertaking the \$12 million project which involves a refurbishment of the Largs North Wastewater Pump Station and the installation of a new 4.5 kilometre sewer main from the Largs North site to the Ethelton Wastewater Pump Station. Work began in April and will take around 12 months to complete.

The new sewer pipeline is being installed using a construction method known as directional boring, which requires less excavation and therefore results in a reduced impact on nearby residents and road users. For more information, including maps and correspondence visit our website.

LINE MARKING IN LIGHTSVIEW

At the March Council meeting, Council resolved to install yellow linemarking in all streets in Lightsview to help make it clear to motorists where the statutory 10 metre 'No Stopping Anytime' parking restrictions are, so that motorists don't park inadvertently too close to an intersection. This work will be carried out over the next six months, starting in areas that have already been fully developed.

Parking too close to an intersection can restrict sight distance for pedestrians and cyclists and other motorists at and on approach to an intersection and the Australian Road Rules are in place to encourage motorists to park a minimum of 10 metres from the intersection to address this requirement.

Usually we do not mark this on our roads as undertaking such a task is quite onerous in a council the size of ours. However, given the demand for parking in Lightsview, Council resolved to install the yellow linemarking to reinforce the Australian Road Rules and make it safer for people to drive in the area.

BUZZING ABOUT NEW B'N'B

The City of PAE is working with seven other Councils, all of which run along our scenic River Torrens from the hills to the sea, to try and increase the number of native bees residing in our state. To do this, we are encouraging residents to build their own "Bee B'n'Bs" or "Bee Hotels" which are nests for native bees that can be set up at home. There are more than 200 different kinds of native bees in South Australia, including blue-banded bees, masked bees, leafcutter bees and resin bees. Native bees help pollinate our native plants and backyard fruits and vegetables. They are interesting to watch and are not aggressive - they will only sting you if you grab them.

HAVE A BUSINESS? HAVE A SAY

Did you know that voting in Council elections is open to a broader range of people than State and Federal elections? An important difference is that businesses and body corporates can vote in Council elections.

Even if you are not an Australian citizen, and not on the State (House of Assembly) electoral roll you can vote in a Council election, as long as you are above 18 years of age and have lived in the Council area for more than one month. You can also vote in a Council election if you own a rateable property in the area, regardless of whether you live in it. You will just need to fill in an application form to be included on City of PAE's supplementary roll.

Because Anna operates a business in Taperoo but resides outside the Council region, upon application, she's eligible to cast her vote for local members for the Outer Harbor ward, and is also eligible for a mayoral vote. You must enrol to vote by Friday 10 August and enrolment forms are available on our website. Council staff can assist you, like they have Anna, to determine your eligibility taking into account your own unique circumstances. So if you are unsure about your voting entitlements please feel free to contact us.

MAJOR SHIPYARD CONSTRUCTION

Recently you may have heard some noise on the peninsula. This is due to construction of major infrastructure at the Osborne Naval Shipbuilding Precinct.

These facilities will deliver new warships and submarines for the Navy. Once in full production, it is expected that over 5,000 South Australians will be employed in the shipyards.

The Osborne Naval Shipbuilding Precinct is the nation's premier naval industry hub located within the former Techport Precinct at Osborne. Late last year, Lendlease was announced as the managing contractor in partnership with Australian Naval Infrastructure, to deliver a new shipyard and upgrade of existing facilities at the precinct.

As a result of these scheduled works, you may experience some low levels of noise and vibration as the piling work begins at the site. Work is scheduled Monday through Saturday each week and expected to continue until late this year.
